
[Issue Descriptions]: Troubleshoot On-Screen Keyboard Function


- Open the Run window by pressing 'Windows key+R'.
- 2. Type "services.msc" and then press Enter.
- 3. In the Services window, double-click on "**Touch Keyboard and Handwriting Panel Service**" to open the properties of this service.
- 4. Make sure the service is running. Set **Startup type to Automatic**.



- 5. Click **Apply**, then **OK** to save your new settings.
- 6. **Restart** your computer and check if the on-screen keyboard is now working. If you see that


the On-Screen keyboard is not functioning properly go for the next steps to check if all the necessary services are running on your computer.

7. In the Touch Keyboard and Handwriting Panel
Service Properties window, go to the
"Dependencies" tab and then expand "Remote
Procedure Call".



8. Note the services under the Remote Procedure Call. Then, close the Properties window.

9. Now, in the Services window, check if those services (which you have noted) are "**Running**" or not.



- 10. Double-click on those two services and set them for automatic.
- 11. Reboot your computer and see whether this configuration is working.
